## MADRONA NEIGHBORHOOD QUESTIONNAIRE RESULTS

At long last the results are in on the questionnaire published in the November and January editions of the newsletter. A total of 64 families responded and \$170 was contributed. A number of good ideas were suggested which the Council will pursue over the next year.

The response indicates that the newsletter and land use issues should be the priority functions of the Council. Neighborhood Cleanup, crime prevention and support of neighborhood businesses were also seen as important by many of the respondents. Other comments addressed the importance of maintaining a sense of community in Madrona and monitoring governmental activity which impacts the neighborhood.

Generally, the responses were not in favor of the Council becoming a dues-paying organization and urged the Council to include all Madrona residents in decision making. There was overwhelming support for paying for the newsletter, but several comments suggested that the newsletter should be mailed to all Madrona residents, regardless of their ability to pay.

Most respondents indicated that \$5/year was the most reasonable amount to pay for the newsletter. 
